Bringing schools, families and our community together

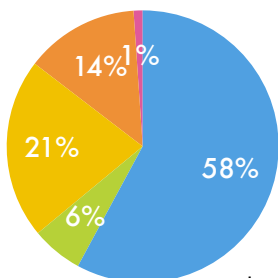
When we think of the little schoolhouse, we think of a place where kids, their families and school folks come together as a community.

In a large district with large schools, that personal touch can be hard to come by. That's why the Fresno Unified School District Safe Schools/Healthy Students Initiative has worked in partnership with the Fresno County Department of Children and Family Services to expand FUSD's role in the K-6 Social Work Program.

The District's Student Services Division selected ten elementary schools that were committed to improving attendance and not yet receiving K-6 services. Each of those schools is assigned a full time K-6 Social Worker.

What do K-6 Social Workers Do?

Social Workers work with children and their families to identify and overcome barriers they are facing in attendance and academic achievement whether it's learning to manage behavior that interferes with learning or connecting their families to services from local agencies, K-6 Social Workers help make their schools the center of the community for many families.
