A-4, APPROVE Agreement with Pace Medical Billing Service for Fresno Adult School

Included in the Board binders is an agreement with Pace Medical Billing Service to allow the use of medical facilities as a training site for Fresno Adult School Medical Training Program. Students involved in the training are enrolled in the Administrative and Clinical Medical Assistant and Medical Billing and Coding programs. A-5, APPROVE and Amended Contract with Moler Barber College for Fresno Adult School

Included in the Board binders is a request from Fresno Adult School to increase the contract amount for Moler Barber College. The current contract (Board approval on June 28, 2006) is for a not to exceed amount of \$85,000.00. Due to an unanticipated increase in student enrollment into this program, and the need for funding for students currently enrolled to complete the program, Fresno Adult School would like to add \$45,000.00 to the contract, for a total not-to-exceed amount of \$130,000.00 for the 2006-07 school year. The contract began on July 1, 2006 and will end on June 30, 2007. The Superintendent recommends approval. A-6, RATIFY an Amended Contract for 2006-2007 with Comprehensive Youth Services (CYS)

Included in the Board binders is an amended contract to provide additional counseling and student assistance services through the Safe and Drug Free Schools, Community Act & Tobacco-Use Prevention Education and the Alcohol Abuse Reduction funds. Additional funds became available from the California Department of Education in April 2007 to extend services to the CYS program. The additional \$117,000 funding of the CYS contract will enable the extension of the Student Assistance Program (SAP) at all district high schools and provide services to middle school and elementary students and families. The contract began May 1, 2007 and will end June 30, 2007. The Superintendent recommends ratification. Fiscal Impact: Funding will be provided through Safe and Drug Free Schools, Community Act & Tobacco-Use Prevention Education and the Alcohol Abuse Reduction grants in the amount of \$117,000. A-7, RATIFY An Independent Contractor Services Agreement with Ann Orcutt for a Physical Therapist

Included in the Board binders is an Independent Contractor Services Agreement with Ann Orcutt to provide physical therapy collaboration to staff and families of identified students. Fresno Unified School District does not employ any physical therapists at this time. A separate contract was previously submitted for this same Contractor in the amount of \$13,000. Additional services are required to complete the school year. A-8, APPROVE an Amended Independent Contractor Services Agreement with Gold Core Networks

Included in the Board binders is an amended Independent Contractor Services Agreement with Gold Core Networks to provide assistance to the Human Resource division. This assistance will be to run Human Resources related systems such as SearchSoft, SmartFinder, web site, fingerprinting database, and other technology related systems. Included in the Board binders is a description of Healthmaster HealthOffice software to complete health management system for schools in Fresno Unified. With its familiar Microsoft Windows interface, HealthOffice is used throughout the school day to properly document detailed information (HIPPA and FERPA compliant) about every student encounter with a healthcare professional. It allows you not only to retrieve records and produce reports, but also secures and stores all health records in a central database. The Superintendent recommends approval. Fiscal Impact: Total of \$152,905 one time cost to be funded from one time salary savings. Annual support costs starting 2008/2009 of \$22,661 funded from the Medi-Cal budget. A team of County Bank officials and a team from Fresno Unified School District visited the Milwaukee and Chicago school branches on March 12 and 13 with officials from the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC), which is also involved and supportive of the program. Kaiser Permanente Fresno has identified priority health and social needs that impact the lives of vulnerable populations.
