

## **BEHAVIORAL EXPECTATIONS**

### **DISCIPLINE/STANDARDS OF CONDUCT**

**Campus** - The privilege of enjoying and participating in Fresno Unified School District activities and utilizing its facilities in a positive environment implies the following responsibilities:

Students will show respect for self and others.

- Verbal abuse, such as profanity, put downs, and racial slurs, will not be tolerated.
- Physical abuse, such as fighting, harassment, hard stares, and extortion, will not be tolerated.
- Cooperation with school personnel will be expected. Students will behave in a manner that provides for a safe and orderly campus.

#### **Activities**

1. Show appropriate spectator and participant behaviors.
2. Show courtesy to others: opponents, guests, and students.
3. Bus riders shall be courteous to the driver, to each other, to pedestrians, and to other drivers.

#### **Bus Riders**

1. Shall be courteous to the bus driver, other riders, pedestrians and other drivers.
2. Follow all district transportation rules, or lose the privilege of using district transportation.

#### **Student Rules of Conduct:**

1. Be in class on time with proper materials and ready to work.
  - a. Have a binder, pencil, pen, paper and other appropriate materials.
  - b. Have your daily/planner/agenda.
  - c. Do not place graffiti, stickers or other decoration your binder or agenda.
2. Be respectful of public and personal property.
3. Be courteous, respectful, and cooperative.

#### **Demonstrate Good Listening Behaviors:**

- eye contact
- good posture
- concentrate
- no side talking
- Sit still

#### **School-Wide Rules**

- Follow directions
- Keep hands, feet and objects to yourself
- Use appropriate school language (no put downs or teasing)

#### **Consequences:**

1. Verbal warning.
2. Conference with student.
3. Phone call to parent or guardian.
4. Sent to Guidance Learning Coordinator.
  5. Sent to Vice Principal.
  6. Placed on non-privileged list.
  7. Parent accompanies student to classes

**Suspension** – Violation of Ed. Code Section 48900 may place students in jeopardy of suspension and/or expulsion. These violations include, but are not exclusive of:

- Damage to or theft of school or private property.
- Infliction of or threatened physical injury to another person.
- Possession or use of tobacco/drugs.

- Commission of obscene acts or engagement in habitual profanity or vulgarity.
- Disruption of school activities.
- Defiance of school authorities.
- Sexual harassment: gestures, words, or unsolicited, inappropriate touching.

**Detention/Campus Clean-up** - School administrators may assign detention at noon, after school or in an Extended Learning Center. Teachers may also hold detention in their rooms before school, after school, or during lunch. Students failing to serve classroom detention will be referred to the grade-level Guidance-learning Coordinator.
